CARPATHIAN CONVENTION IS A SUB REGIONAL TREATY TO FOSTER THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AND THE PROTECTION OF THE CARPATHIAN REGION

SIGNED MAY 2003 BY SEVEN CARPATHIAN STATES SUCH AS CZECH REPUBLIC, HUNGARY, POLAND, ROMANIA, SERBIA, SLOVAK REPUBLIC, UKRAINE

FRAMEWORK CONVENTION ON THE PROTECTION AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT OF THE CARPATHIANS (CARPATHIAN CONVENTION) WAS ADOPTED AND SIGNED IN MAY 2003 IN KYIV, UKRAINE, AND ENTERED INTO FORCE IN JANUARY 2006

ONLY CONVENTION IN CARPATHIAN REGION FOR THE PROTECTION AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT OF A MOUNTAIN REGION WORLDWIDE

FOCUS ON IMPROVEMENT OF THE QUALITY OF LIVE, THE STRENGTHENING OF LOCAL ECONOMIES AND COMMUNITIES, AND THE CONSERVATION OF NATURAL VALUES AND CULTURAL HERITAGE IN CARPATHIAN REGION

PROVIDES A FRAMEWORK FOR COOPERATION AND MULTI-SECTORAL POLICY COORDINATION, A PLATFORM FOR JOINT STRATEGIES FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT, AND A FORUM FOR DIALOGUE BETWEEN ALL STAKEHOLDERS INVOLVED – FROM THE LOCAL COMMUNITY AND VARIOUS NGO'S UP TO THE REGIONAL AND NATIONAL GOVERNMENTS, INSTITUTIONS OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AND THE UNITED NATIONS
