MAINS

1. Answer: D

Explanation

- Imposing a pan-India ban on instant 'bulldozer justice', Supreme Court has held
 demolition of a citizen's house merely because he is an accused or even a convict, that too
 without following the due process as prescribed by law, will be "totally unconstitutional".
- The apex court underlined that **right to shelter is part of right to life guaranteed under Article 21** of the Constitution. Hence, **answer is option D**.
- It laid down **detailed guidelines** for razing illegal structures and ruled that a **state cannot breach a family's right to shelter** by demolishing their house only because one of its members is accused of a heinous crime.
- The order calls for **15 days' notice**, served on the owner by registered post, containing details of the violations as well as the grounds for the action to be taken.
- A **personal hearing**, a **reasoned order** and an **inspection report** signed by witnesses have also been made mandatory.

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2. Answer: C

Explanation

Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act:

- As a signatory to the United Nations Convention on Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD), India is obligated to promote accessibility as an essential right. Hence, statements 1 and 3 are correct.
- Enacted in 2016, the RPwD Act draws on the CRPD and aims "to ensure that all persons with disabilities can lead their lives with dignity, without discrimination and with equal opportunities." Hence, statement 2 is correct.
 - The Act increased types of disabilities from existing 7 to 21.
 - All Government institutions of higher education and those getting aid from the Government are required to reserve at least 5% of seats for persons with benchmark disabilities.
 - Four percent reservation for persons with benchmark disabilities is to be provided in posts of all Government establishments with differential quotas for different forms of disabilities.
 - **Incentives to employers in the private sector** are to be given who provide **5% reservation** for persons with benchmark disability.
- The **RPwD Rules of 2017**, framed under the Act, were to lay down specific accessibility standards.
- So far, **17 standards and guidelines** have been notified across government ministries and departments. The **lack of uniformity across the different guidelines** would create issues in enforcement, the SC noted.
- It ad<mark>ded</mark> that once the mandatory rules are prescribed, the Centre, state governments and union territories would have to **ensure that non-compliance with the accessibility standards is penalised.**

Why in news?

- A bench of the Supreme Court has ordered the Union government to frame mandatory rules for ensuring the accessibility of public places and services to persons with disabilities.
- The apex court reaffirmed accessibility as a fundamental right and noted that the
 provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act were not being
 treated as mandatory.

3. Answer: A

Explanation

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Generic drugs

- When a company develops a new drug often after years of research it applies for a patent, which **prohibits anyone else from making the drug for a fixed period** (usually 20 years unless specified).
- To recover the cost of research and development, companies usually price their brandname drugs on the higher side.
- Once the patent expires, other manufacturers duplicate and market their own versions of the drug known as **Generic drugs**. Hence, **statement 1** is **correct**.
- A generic drug is created to be the same as an already existing brand-name drug in dosage form, safety, strength, route of administration, quality, performance characteristics, and intended use. Hence, statement 2 is incorrect.
- Generic drugs are **equally effective and inexpensive (50%-90% less) com**pared to their branded **coun**terparts. Hence, **statement 3 is incorrect.**

4. Answer: A

Explanation

About Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY)

- The Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas launched PMUY to release deposit free LPG connections in the name of adult women members of poor households across the country. Hence, statement 2 is incorrect.
- Launched in **2016**, the primary objective of the PMUY is to **provide access to clean cooking fuel LPG** to poor households thereby protecting their health by reducing the serious health hazards associated with use of conventional cooking fuel such as firewood, coal, cow dung etc. Hence, **statement 1 is correct.**
- Under the scheme, **cash assistance of Rs. 1600** is given to the beneficiaries to get a deposit-free new connection.
- Additionally, all PMUY beneficiaries will be provided with first LPG refill and stove (hotplate) both free of cost by the Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs).
- A **targeted subsidy of Rs.300** per LPG cylinder for upto 12 refills per year is also provided to PMUY consumers.

Beneficiaries

- Initially, the beneficiaries were identified through Socio Economic Caste Census (SECC), 2011 data.
- The scope of PMUY was later expanded to cover all the poor families in the country subject to fulfilling the terms and conditions.

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5. Answer: A

Explanation:

- In 2021, Government of India had declared that the **birth anniversary (15th November)** of Bhagwan Birsa Munda will be celebrated as **Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas**. Hence, **answer is option A**.
- Birsa Munda (1875–1900) was a **religious leader and folk hero** from the **Munda Tribe** of the **Chhota Nagpur Plateau area**.
- He spearheaded a tribal religious movement named Munda Rebellion/Ulgulan/ Great
 Tumult that arose in the tribal belt of modern-day Bihar and Jharkhand in the late 19th
 century, as a response to the oppressive policies of the British such as new land settlement
 systems.
