Solutions:

1. Answer: C

Explanation

- **Carbon leakage** refers to the situation where a company relocates its production to a country with **less stringent environmental regulations** to **avoid stricter regulations in its home country.** Hence, **answer is option C.**
- Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism allows industries in Europe to remain competitive while continuing to maintain high environmental standards and prevents carbon leakage.

About Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism

- **Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism** is the European Union's tool to put a fair price on the **carbon emitted** during the **production of carbon intensive goods that are entering the European Union (EU),** and to **encourage cleaner industrial production** in non-EU countries.
- Currently, the CBAM applies to **iron and steel**, **cement**, **fertilizers**, **aluminum**, **electricity**, **and hydrogen**. The scope may expand to include more products in the future.

2. Answer: D

Explanation Impacts of Solar Cycle

• Giant eruptions on the Sun, such as **solar flares** and **coronal mass ejections (CMEs)**, increase during the solar cycle. These eruptions send **powerful bursts of energy and material** into space. Hence, **impacts 1 ans 2 are correct**.

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- This activity can have **effects on Earth**. For example, eruptions can cause **aurora**, or **impact radio communications**. Extreme eruptions can even **affect electricity grids on Earth**. Hence, **impacts 3 ans 4 are correct**.
- Solar activity can **affect satellite electronics** and limit their lifetime. Hence, **impact 5 is correct**

3. Answer: B

Explanation

Government Initiatives and Schemes to Promote Sustainable Fisheries Fisheries and Aquaculture Infrastructure Development Fund (FIDF):

- FIDF was introduced in 2018-19 to provide funding for the creation of infrastructure in both marine and inland fisheries. Hence, statement 1 is incorrect.
- FIDF loans can **cover up to 80% of the project cost, with interest subvention of up to 3%**.
- This financial support is essential for fish farmers, entrepreneurs, and cooperatives looking to improve the infrastructure required to scale up production.

National Policy on Marine Fisheries (NPMF, 2017):

- The Government of India has introduced the NPMF, which places a **strong emphasis on sustainability** as the core principle for all marine fisheries actions. Hence, **statement 2 is correct**.
- This policy guides the conservation and management of India's marine fishery resources.

Blue Revolution Integrated Development and Management Fisheries Scheme or Blue Revolution Scheme:

• Launched in FY 2015-16, the scheme primarily focused on increasing fish production and productivity.

Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY):

- Launched in 2020, it is a flagship initiative aimed at **transforming India's fisheries sector**.
- The scheme focuses on **enhancing aquaculture productivity**, **improving fisheries management**, and **creating 55 lakh new jobs** in the sector, along with **big infrastructural changes of establishing five integrated aqua parks**.
- It also envisages **doubling fisheries exports to 1 lakh crores.**

Indian fisheries sector

- As the **3rd largest fish producer**, **2nd largest aquaculture nation** in the world after **China** and the **largest producer of shrimp**, **India** contributes significantly to both domestic food security and the global seafood market.
- The **Indian fisheries sector** not only supports the livelihoods of around **30 million people**, especially in coastal and rural communities, but it also holds immense potential for growth, job creation, and rural development.
- In recent years, Indian fisheries have experienced a **significant shift**, **moving from a marine-dominated sector to a greater focus on inland fisheries**.
- Recognized as a **"sunrise sector,"** it is poised to make a significant contribution to the Indian economy in the near future, driven by its vast potential for growth and development.

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• Initially **dominated by marine fish production**, the sector has seen a **significant shift towards inland fisheries**, which now contributes around **70% of the country's total fish production**.

4. Answer: A

Explanation

- The International Criminal Court (ICC) is a permanent judicial body established by the **Rome Statute** of the International Criminal Court (1998). Hence, **statement 1 is correct.**
- It is an independent judicial body distinct from the UN. Hence, statement 2 is incorrect.
- ICC **investigates and tries individuals** charged with the gravest crimes of concern to the international community: genocide, war crimes, crimes against humanity and the crime of aggression.
- The ICC was established as a **court of last resort** to prosecute the most heinous offenses in cases where national courts fail to act.
- It is headquartered in **The Hague, Netherlands.** Hence, **statement 3 is correct.**

5. Answer: C

Explanation:

Svalbard Global Seed Vault

- It is a secure seed bank located on the island of Spitsbergen in the Svalbard archipelago in Norway.
- The Seed Vault is managed by the Norwegian government, the Crop Trust, and the Nordic Genetic Resource Center. Hence, statement 1 is incorrect.
- It serves as a **global backup facility for seeds of various plant species**, safeguarding the **world's food supply** against **potential catastrophes** such as mismanagement, accident, war, disease, and natural disasters. Hence, **statement 2 is correct**.
- The seeds are stored in storage rooms kept at -18 °C (-0.4 °F) as low temperature and limited access to oxygen will ensure low metabolic activity and delay seed aging. Hence, statement 3 is correct.
- The **permafrost** surrounding the seed vault will help in **maintaining low temperature** of the seed vault in case of power outage.
