#### **PRASHAD Scheme**

- The 'National Mission on Pilgrimage Rejuvenation and Spiritual, Heritage Augmentation
  Drive' (PRASHAD) was launched by the Ministry of Tourism in the year 2014-15 with the
  objective of integrated development of identified pilgrimage and heritage
  destinations. Hence, statement 1 is correct.
- It is a **Central Sector Scheme with complete financial assistance by the Government of India**. Hence, **statement 2 is incorrect**.
- The scheme has been launched with the vision of focused infrastructure development to harness pilgrimage and heritage tourism destinations for its direct and multiplier effect upon employment generation and economic development.

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 The scheme aimed at infrastructure development such as entry points (Road, Rail and Water Transport), last mile connectivity, basic tourism facilities like Information/ Interpretation Centers, ATM/ Money exchange, eco-friendly modes of transport, area Lighting and illumination with renewable sources of energy, parking, drinking water, toilets, etc.

### **Implementation Agency**

• The projects identified under this scheme shall be implemented through the identified agencies by the respective State/ Union Territory Government. Hence, statement 3 is correct.

# Explanation Digital Bharat Nidhi

- The Universal Service Obligation Fund (USOF) was established under the Indian Telegraph (Amendment) Act, 2003 in 2002. Hence, statement 1 is incorrect.
- The Telecommunications Act, 2023 renamed USOF as Digital Bharat Nidhi (DBN).
- The DBN has the mandate to support universal service through promoting access and delivery of telecommunication service in underserved rural, remote and urban areas. Hence, statement 2 is correct.
- The balance to the credit of DBN, collected as **Universal Access Levy**, **does not lapse at the end of the financial year**. Hence, **statement 3 is incorrect**.

# Explanation About Hepatitis

- Hepatitis refers to an inflammatory condition of the liver. Usually caused by a viral
  infection, but there exists other possible causes of hepatitis which are autoimmune
  responses, medications, drugs, toxins, and alcohol. Hence, statement 1 is incorrect.
- There are **5 main hepatitis viruses**, referred to as types **A, B, C, D, and E**.
- Acute infection may occur with limited or no symptoms, or may include **symptoms** such as **jaundice** (yellowing of the skin and eyes), **dark urine**, extreme fatigue, nausea, vomiting and abdominal pain Hence, **statement 2** is **correct**.

# **About Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons**

- The Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW) is the **implementing body for the Chemical Weapons Convention**, which prohibits the development, production, stock-piling and use of chemical weapons. Hence, **statement 1** is **correct.**
- The OPCW, with its 193 Member States (including **India**), oversees the global endeavour to permanently and verifiably eliminate chemical weapons. Hence, **statements 2 and 3 are correct.**
- OPCW was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 2013 for its comprehensive efforts to eliminate chemical weapons.

### **One Nation One Subscription**

- The Union Cabinet has approved One Nation One Subscription, a new Central Sector Scheme for providing country-wide access to scholarly research articles and journal publication. Hence, answer is option C.
- The scheme will be administered through a simple, user friendly and fully digital process.
- The benefits of One Nation One Subscription scheme will be provided to all Higher
  Educational Institutions under the management of the Central or State Government
  and Research & Development Institutions of the Central Government, through a
  national subscription coordinated by a central agency, namely the Information and
  Library Network (INFLIBNET), an autonomous inter-university centre of the University
  Grants Commission (UGC).
- The initiative will **expand access to scholarly journals** to a vast diaspora of students, faculty, researchers and scientists of all disciplines, including those in tier 2 and tier 3 cities, thereby promoting core as well as interdisciplinary research in the country.
