1. Answer: A

Explanation

Border Security Force

- The Border Security Force (BSF) is the **largest border guarding force in the world** with a strength of nearly 2.65 lakh personnel. Hence, **statement 1 is correct.**
- It was formed in the wake of the Indo-Pakistani War of 1965.
- BSF was created as a paramilitary force under the Ministry of Home Affairs to safeguard India's borders with Pakistan and later with Bangladesh, ensuring national security, preventing illegal activities, and supporting counter-insurgency operations. Hence, statements 2 and 3 are incorrect.
- Since its inception, BSF has played a crucial role in defending India's territorial integrity and maintaining peace along the borders.

2. Answer: C

Explanation

- Every employer is required to constitute an **Internal Complaints Committee** at each office or branch with **10 or more employees.**
- Every district will have a **Local Complaints Committee (LCC)** so as to enable women in the unorganised sector or small establishments to work in an environment free of sexual harassment.
- The LCC will receive complaints:
 - From women working in an organisation having less than 10 workers;
 - When the complaint is against the employer himself;

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- From domestic workers. Hence, **statement 1 is correct.**
- At least 50 percent of the nominated members in any Internal or Local Committee must be women.
- The Complaints Committees have the powers of **civil courts** for gathering evidence. Hence, **statement 2 is correct.**
- The Complaints Committees are required to provide for **conciliation** before initiating an inquiry, if requested by the complainant.

3. Answer: C

Explanation

How does a Foreigners Tribunal (FT) function?

- According to the 1964 order, an FT has the **powers of a civil court in certain matters** such as summoning and enforcing the attendance of any person and examining him or her on oath and requiring the production of any document. Hence, **statement 1 is correct.**
- An FT has to dispose of a case within 60 days of reference.
- If the person fails to provide any proof of citizenship, the FT can send him or her to a detention centre, now called transit camp, for deportation later. Hence, statement 2 is correct.

About Foreigners Tribunal

- The Foreigners Tribunals (FTs) are quasi-judicial bodies formed through the Foreigners (Tribunals) Order of 1964 under the Foreigners' Act of 1946.
- The 1964 order allows local authorities in a State to refer a person suspected to be a foreigner to tribunals.
- The FTs are **currently exclusive to Assam** as cases of "illegal immigrants" are dealt with according to the Foreigners' Act in other States.
- Each FT is headed by a member drawn from judges, advocates, and civil servants with judicial experience.

4. Answer: C

Explanation

Categories of AIF:

- Category I AIF:
 - Venture capital funds (Including Angel Funds). Hence, **fund 1 is correct.**
 - Social Venture Funds
 - Infrastructure funds
- **Category II AIF** (real estate funds, private equity funds, funds for distressed assets, etc). Hence, **fund 5 is correct.**

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- **Category III AIF** (hedge funds, private investment in public equity (PIPE) Funds, etc.). Hence, **fund 3 is correct.**
 - Mutual funds and Exchange traded funds are not covered under Alternate Investment funds. Hence, **answer is option C.**

About AIF:

- Alternative Investment Fund or AIF is a privately pooled investment vehicle, which
 collects funds from investors, for investing it in accordance with a defined investment policy
 for the benefit of its investors.
- AIF does not include funds covered under the SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations, 1996, SEBI (Collective Investment Schemes) Regulations, 1999 or any other regulations of the Board to regulate fund management activities.
- In India, AIFs are regulated by the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Alternative Investment Funds) Regulations, 2012.

5. Answer: B

Explanation:

To enable all other initiatives (under Atal Innovation Mission) to succeed, AIM has
launched the "Mentor India – The Mentors of Change" programme, in collaboration with
the public sector, corporates and institutions, to support all the initiatives of the mission.
Hence, answer is option B.
