1. Answer: A

Explanation:

Outcomes of UNFCCC COP 29

- New Collective Quantified Goal (NCQG):
 - The NCQG is the amount that must be mobilised by developed countries every year from 2025 onward to finance climate action in developing countries.
 - Developed countries have agreed to triple finance to developing countries, from the previous goal of USD 100 billion annually, to USD 300 billion annually by 2035.
- Carbon Markets:
 - COP 29 agreed on the rules and methodologies for the international carbon trading system envisioned by Article 6 of the Paris Agreement.
 - Article 6 sets out a system in which countries can trade emission reduction credits between themselves so that an emission reduction in one country can be counted against the emissions generated in another country.
- Baku Workplan:
 - The Baku Workplan adopted at COP29 aims to **elevate the voices of Indigenous Peoples and local communities in climate action.**
- COP29 Hydrogen Declaration:

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- It endorsed the **commitment to scale up renewable, clean/zero-emission and low-carbon hydrogen production** and accelerate the decarbonisation of existing hydrogen production from unabated fossil fuels.
- COP 29 Declaration on reducing methane from organic wastes: *Hence statement 1 is correct.*
 - Around 30 countries, collectively responsible for nearly 50% of global methane from organic waste emissions, endorsed the COP29 declaration on reducing methane from organic waste.
 - It aims to set **sectoral targets to reduce methane from organic waste.**
 - India is not a signatory to the Declaration. Hence statement 2 is incorrect.

2. Answer: C

Explanation:

What are Urban vegetated canopies?

- Vegetated canopies are tensioned sail-like structures that are anchored to the facades
 (front exterior face or elevation of a building) of buildings. Hence statement 1 is correct.
- They **mimic natural canopies** found in forests.
- It aims at incorporating greenery, such as plants, vines, or other vegetation, on the exterior surfaces of structures within urban areas.
- This approach, often referred to as "green facades" or "vertical greening", aims to integrate vegetation into the built environment.

Types of urban vegetated canopies

- **Green roofs** involve growing vegetation on rooftops of buildings. They provide insulation, reduce stormwater runoff, improve air quality, and create green spaces in densely populated areas.
- **Living walls** are vertical structures covered with vegetation, often attached to the exterior or interior walls of buildings. They can be soil-based, hydroponic, or aeroponic systems supporting a variety of plant species.
- **Green screens** are vertical panels covered with climbing plants or vines. They provide visual screening, reduce noise, and improve air quality.

Benefits of Urban vegetated canopies

- Greenery on buildings can act as a natural insulator, reducing heat absorption and lowering indoor temperatures, thereby reducing the urban heat island effect. Hence statement 2 is correct.
- Plants and vegetation can help filter pollutants from the air, and help in improving air quality.
- They can help **manage stormwater** by absorbing and retaining rainwater, reducing runoff and alleviating strain on drainage systems. **Hence statement 3 is correct.**
- Vegetated canopies can provide **habitat** for birds, insects, and other wildlife, which can help to boost biodiversity in urban areas.

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3. Answer: B

Explanation:

About the Scheme

- In a bid to boost solar power and sustainable progress, the Government of India launched the PM-Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana (PM-SGMBY) in February 2024 for installing rooftop solar in one crore households nationwide.
- The scheme aims to provide free electricity up to 300 units every month to the one crore households of the country. Hence statement 1 is incorrect.

Key Provisions

- Under the scheme, the households who opt to install rooftop solar electricity units will get 300 units of electricity for free every month.
- The scheme **focuses on the household segment with up to 3 kW systems**, which covers most of the residential consumers in India.
- The households will apply for subsidy through the **National Portal** (https://pmsuryaghar.gov.in) and will be able to select a suitable vendor for installing rooftop solar.

Other Features of the Scheme

- A **Model Solar Village** will be developed in **each district** of the country to act as a role model for adoption of rooftop solar in rural areas. **Hence statement 2 is correct.**
- **Urban Local Bodies and Panchayati Raj Institutions** shall also benefit from incentives for promoting Rooftop Solar installations in their areas.
- Through this scheme, the households will be **able to save electricity bills** as well as **earn** additional income through sale of surplus power to DISCOMs.

Who is eligible for PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana?

- Individuals must meet the following criteria to apply for the scheme:
 - 1. Indian citizenship.
 - 2. Ownership of a house with a suitable roof for solar panel installation.
 - 3. Possession of a valid electricity connection.
 - 4. Absence of prior subsidies for solar panels.

4. Answer: C

Explanation:

- The Human Rights Council is an inter-governmental body within the United Nations system.
- UNHRC is responsible for strengthening the promotion and protection of human rights
 around the globe and for addressing situations of human rights violations and making
 recommendations on them.

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- It has the ability to discuss all thematic human rights issues and situations that require its attention throughout the year.
- The Council was created by the **United Nations General Assembly** in **2006**. It **replaced** the former United Nations Commission on Human Rights.
- The headquarters of UNHRC is in **Geneva**, **Switzerland**. **Hence statement 1 is correct**. **Membership**
 - The Council is made of **47 Member States**, which are elected by the majority of members of the General Assembly of the United Nations through **direct and secret ballot**. **Hence statement 3 is correct.**
 - The Council's Membership is based on **equitable geographical distribution**. **Hence statement 2 is correct**.
 - Members of the Council serve for a period of three years and are not eligible for immediate re-election after serving two consecutive terms.

5. Answer: D

Explanation:

- **Objective Resolution:** This Resolution was introduced by **Jawaharlal Nehru**. It articulated the fundamental goals of the Constitution, emphasising justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity, which would serve as guiding principles throughout the drafting process. **Hence statement 1** is incorrect.
- **Drafting Committee:** Chaired by Dr BR Ambedkar, it was f**ormed in 1947** to translate the ideals of Objective Resolution into a **comprehensive legal framework**.
- The Constituent Assembly meticulously crafted the Constitution, balancing the aspirations of a diverse population while addressing the historical injustices stemming from colonial rule.
- On 26 November 1949, the Constitution was adopted, marking a momentous occasion in India's history. This date is celebrated annually as Constitution Day. Hence statement 2 is incorrect.
- The Constitution officially came into effect on 26 January 1950, a date now commemorated as Republic Day, symbolising the transition from colonial rule to self-governance. Hence statement 3 is incorrect.

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
